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Course Components

This course has two parts: this study course and the exam booklet.

How To Study

This study has eight chapters, and each chapter has its own exam. Begin by asking God to help you understand the material. Read the chapter through at least twice, once to get a general idea of its contents and then again, slowly, looking up any Bible references given. Begin studying immediately, or if you are in a group, as soon as the group begins. We suggest that you keep a regular schedule by trying to complete at least one chapter per week.

Exams

In the exam booklet there is one exam for each chapter (exam 1 covers chapter 1 of the course). Do not answer the questions by what you think or have always believed. The questions are designed to find out if you understand the material given in the course.

After you have completed each chapter, review the related exam and see how well you know the answers. If you find that you are having difficulty answering the questions, review the material until you think you can answer the questions. It is important that you read the Bible passages referenced as some questions may be based on the Bible text.

How Your Exams Are Graded

Your instructor will mark any incorrectly answered questions. You will be referred back to the place in the course where the correct answer is to be found. After finishing this course with a passing average, you will be awarded a certificate.

If you enrolled in a class, submit your exam papers to the leader or secretary of the class who will send them for the entire group to the Correspondence School.

THE BASIC FACT

A Self-Evident Truth

By telling us of the size, number, orbits, and velocities of the heavenly bodies. The earth, for example, a relatively small planet, weighs six sextillion tons, while the sun is large enough to hold one and a half million worlds the size of our earth. Although it is losing weight at the rate of 4,200,000 tons of heat a second, the sun's mass is so great

that 150 billion years from now it will have diminished by only 1%! The sun itself is a star, one of an estimated ten octillion stars in space and a small star at that. It is estimated that the star Antares could contain 64,000,000 suns as large as ours! Only an all-powerful God could create and place in orbit such enormous masses.

8. How does astronomy bear witness to the fact that God is omniscient (all-wise)?

By telling us of the complex mechanism of the universe. There are billions of galaxies in space, all moving at fantastic speeds on fixed paths according to changeless laws. They move with such mathematical exactness that astronomers can predict the visit of a comet or the occasion of an eclipse years in advance. Sir James Jeans, the famous British scientist, once stated that the universe was fashioned by a "pure Mathematician."

11. How does astronomy bear witness to the fact that God is omnipresent (present everywhere)?

Light travels at the speed of 186,300 miles per second. Light reaching the earth today from some of the remotest galaxies is reckoned to have been traveling at that speed for five billion light years to reach us. When we consider the age of the universe and remember that the Creator was present "in the beginning," it is evident that He must be eternal.

- 15. Has science really increased man's knowledge of ultimate realities? Science has certainly documented a vast array of facts about the universe. But at the same time it has revealed how much man doesn't know. The more the frontiers of knowledge are pushed back by science, the vaster become the areas of the great unknown. Every question science answers in any given field only seems to raise even more. Yet everywhere there is the same evidence of law and order, of a thinking mind behind it all—the mind of God.
- 16. Are there some things science will never know?

Yes. The origin of the universe, for example, is outside the realm of scientific investigation. The scientist who speaks of "origins" speaks as a philosopher rather than as a scientist. He says what he *thinks*, not what he *knows*. He deals with *theories*, not with *facts*.

- 17. Since in some realms the scientist cannot speak with authority, how must we accept his statements?By faith.
